Village Board News

Streamwood Environmental Education Day (SEED) Recap

The annual event, held on April 29, had 336 residents recycle 22,308 lbs of electronic goods; 166 shredding customers fill over a truckload of paper materials, 115 people walk through the educational exhibit in the police



station, and we collected 140 lbs of prescription drugs. Including our holiday lights collection of 1,664 lbs earlier this year, we have helped to keep harmful elements and chemicals out of the waste stream this year!

Citizens Police Academy

The 2023 Streamwood Citizens Police Academy wrapped up at the end of May. For ten weeks, fifteen Streamwood residents attended various police-related instructional classes to gain a better understanding of the programs and services within the Streamwood Police Department. The series of classes included a narcotic intervention overview. traffic safety demonstration by the Illinois State Police, patrol tactics, SWAT, Major Case Assistance Team, Northwest Central Dispatch tour, training on the department simulator, investigations overview, K-9 demonstrations, and domestic violence intervention, through open forum discussions to hands-on practical training. The academy continues to grow





community engagement and partnership between the police department and residents. The class was recognized at the June 15 Village Board Meeting for their participation.

Community Blood Drive

At the April 26 blood drive, the Blood Commission had 50 successful donors, allowing Vitalant to collect 56 units of blood, which was the highest amount since the pandemic. Each donor received a thank you gift. In addition, "Six to Sixteen Multigallon Donors" were recognized for saving thousands of lives. Each person was presented with a certificate and Village of Streamwood swag bag. The Streamwood Blood Commission thanks all donors who give blood to save lives!



Please know that each day someone in the U.S. needs blood — every 2 seconds of every day, a patient receives a blood or platelet transfusion. And that blood can only come from volunteer donors like you; there is no substitute for human blood. One blood donation can save up to three lives! The next community blood drive will be on Wednesday, August 23, from 1:00 pm to 7:00 pm, at the Fire Station 31 (1204 S. Park Ave). Noise Control Regulations

The Village has noise control regulations setting specific hours for loud noises to allow the police to control these issues. Noise complaints in residential areas include loud music, late night parties, yelling and shouting while concerns in the business areas tend toward amplified sounds, garbage collection, and loading and unloading. In general, no construction, loud music, garbage collection, loading and unloading will be permitted between the hours of 10:00 pm and 7:00 am on weekdays, and 10:00 pm and 10:00 am on the weekends. Exceptions are permitted for emergencies, and other events. If you are concerned about loud noises in your area, please contact the Streamwood Police Department by calling 9-1-1.


Do You Have Old Eyeglasses Or Hearing Aids To Discard?

The Streamwood Lions Club has a collection box at Village Hall. Simply drop off your unwanted eyeglasses or hearing aids at the cashier counter and the Lions Club will recycle them.

Pet Updates

Just a few reminders for all Streamwood pet owners:

- Only three (3) animals (except for new litters) are allowed in a single household. Village Code 4-2-2 No residence shall maintain or house more than three (3) animals except for a new litter up to the age of four (4) months. This provision may not apply to the keeping of caged birds or aquatic and caged amphibian animals solely as pets.
- All pets on property other than that of its owner shall be under control and on a leash. Village Code 4-2-3 No household domesticated animals shall be allowed on the streets of the Village of Streamwood or in public places or upon property other than that of its owner, unless under the control of the owner and kept on a suitable, dependable leash or tether.





Please obtain a garage sale permit before the sale is conducted. There is a \$1.00 charge for the permit. Please note that only TWO garage sales per year are permitted for each address and each sale is only permitted for TWO consecutive days, between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm.

Planning A Block Party?

Block Party applications are available at the cashier's counter at Village Hall and on the Village's website. The forms provide the party planners with necessary details (Fire Department and/or Police Department visits and Public Works barricades) needed BEFORE the date of their party. All Block Party applications must be filed with the Village Clerk at least 14 days before the requested party date.

Planning To Cut Any Tress?

Please call Public Works at 630-736-3850 before cutting any trees on your property. Forestry Department personnel will check the tree, its location, etc. This is a FREE service.

Police Beat Meetings

The Streamwood Police Department patrols the Village in distinct geographic areas, called "beats", and holds regular meetings with the community. The primary purpose of a beat meeting is to provide police, residents, and other community stake holders with the opportunity to discuss conditions in the neighborhood and develop strategies to address any concerns. Regular meetings also provide an opportunity for the police and community to get to know one another. The August beat meetings will be held in the police station training room (401 E Irving Park Road), at 7:00 pm. Beats #2 and #3 will be held on Tuesday, August 22; Beats #1 and #4 on Thursday, August 24.



Fire Department's File of Life Program

Medical emergencies can happen anytime. When they do, there can be confusion, panic, and urgency. Firefighter/ Paramedics arrive on the scene and may not have any information about the person in need. Seconds count and quick access to vital medical information can help with a successful medical outcome! Does the patient have any medical conditions? Allergies? What medications are they taking? What is the dose? Who do they want us to call? How do we contact their family or friends?

File of Life puts these answers at the fingertips of responding Firefighter/Paramedics. It allows them to immediately begin

the best possible treatment, notify loved ones, and pass this vital data on to awaiting physicians at the emergency room.

The Streamwood Fire Department believes the File of Life is an asset for emergency preparedness and peace of mind for every resident in our community. We provide free File of Life magnetic pouches with a 'file' insert. The cards are about 4x6 inches and meant to be kept on the refrigerator or somewhere easily seen by first responders.

Next Phase Of Unite U-46

Local residents are encouraged to get involved in the next stage of the community engagement initiative Unite U-46. The first phase of Unite U-46's work helped develop recommendations in 2022 and 2023 on the best way to implement the vision of the Board of Education, leading to the passage of a zero-tax-rate-change bond proposal in April 2023. As this work moves forward, Unite U-46 will now pivot to focus on keeping the entire community informed and engaged as construction and renovation plans and projects are confirmed. U-46 Celebrates The Class of 2023

Family members, friends, and U-46 employees turned out in large numbers on Saturday, May 27, to celebrate more than 2,700 students who graduated as members of the Class of 2023. Five commencement ceremonies were held at the NOW Arena to honor the students who graduated from Bartlett, Elgin, Larkin, South Elgin, and Streamwood High Schools.

Of the graduates, nearly 600 students participated in the district's award-winning dual language program; which many of them had been a part of since 1st grade, when the program first became available to them. More than 400 graduates earned the State of Illinois Seal of Biliteracy, showing that they've demonstrated proficiency in one or more languages besides English. Approximately 300 earned the Commendation, given to students who have demonstrated significant progress toward achieving a high level of proficiency. Languages that students earned the Seal for include Spanish, Polish, Korean, German, Italian, Turkish and Gujarati; the Commendation included Hindi and French.









The Class of 2023 graduates also included 26 Superintendent's Scholarship recipients, a program that honors first-generation college students, and 68 students who participated in the full-time Dual Credit program on the campus of Elgin Community College. Forty of those students graduated high school with the equivalent of an associate degree in addition to their high school diploma.
