## Village Board News

### 2024 Goals and Objectives Approved

The Village Board recently adopted its 2024 Goals and Objectives. The annual Goals and Objectives provide a blueprint to create our budget and determine key priorities for service and improvements in the community. Our ongoing priorities remain keeping our budget balanced and continuing quality programs and services to the community. The Board reaffirmed their commitment toward the implementation of our Comprehensive Plan in its 2024 focus goals. Specific projects include improved communications with development of a social media presence; investments in our community and facilities; by completing building updates and revising our water and sewer rate structure; and, creating a legacy of connected trails and open spaces, with the installation of a bridge across Route 59 and developing options for Kollar Pond as a gateway to our municipal campus.



### Trustee William W. Harper Retires

At the October 5 Village Board meeting, Trustee Harper was recognized for his 34 years of outstanding public service as a Village Trustee. Bill and his family moved to Streamwood in 1986. At that time, the population was just over 25,000. He was first elected Village Trustee in 1989. As a Board member for over three decades, Trustee Harper helped make policy decisions necessary to maintain and enhance the health, safety, and welfare of our community. Bill was a critical thinker on the Board. He analyzed our budgets, audits, and advanced a water rate plan that benefited the community while ensuring our infrastructure was well-maintained. He took his role as a guardian of the taxpayers' trust to heart. He has been a steadfast proponent for our pay-as-you-go philosophy, recognizing it as a foundation to keep Streamwood running efficiently. As part of this philosophy, Bill was also instrumental in developing funding strategies for managing our infrastructure, equipment, and facilities to minimize its impact on taxpayers. Members of the current and past Village Board and staff, along with neighboring dignitaries, were on hand to recognize his contributions. On behalf of the residents of Streamwood, the Village Board and staff would like to thank Bill for his dedicated service to our community.

### **Yard Waste Pickup Ends**

The week of December 11-15, yard waste pick up with trash collection ends. Please note raking leaves into the street is prohibited. Do not rake, sweep, or blow leaves into the street as it can clog storm sewer inlets and create flooding. All yard waste must be placed into approved containers for collection by Groot.

### **Holiday Trash Collection**

Here is how the upcoming holidays will affect your trash pickup: Thanksgiving (Thursday and Friday collection will be one day later); Christmas and New Year's Day (ALL collection will be one day later). Questions? Please call Groot Industries at 847-419-7370 or download the Groot app and get automatic notifications.

### **Keep The Snow On The Parkway**

Please be reminded that it is unlawful to shovel or blow snow into the street. This is especially important after the plows come through. The plows clear the snow and lay salt. If you shovel snow onto the roadway, it can create ice slicks leading to dangerous road conditions. Please shovel or blow the snow to either side of your driveway.

### **Parking**

Parking is prohibited on Village streets between the hours of 1:00 am and 5:00 am, except where noted in specific subdivisions. Parking is also prohibited after a 2" or greater snowfall until streets are fully plowed. Please remember, through November 30, vehicles parked in residential driveways CANNOT block the sidewalk or parkway between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm, Saturday and Sunday. However, vehicles, in residential driveways, may block the sidewalk or parkway from December 1 through February 28. Questions? Please call 630-736-3700.

### **Electric Portable Space Heater Safety**

When the weather turns cold, it can get chilly in our homes. Portable space heaters are a common way to supplement central heating or to warm up one room or area. Heating equipment, such as space heaters, is a leading cause of fires in U.S. homes. Nearly half (46%) of all home heating fires occur in December, January, and February. If you plan to use portable electric space heaters, the Streamwood Fire Department would like you to follow these recommendations: never use extension cords with space heaters — plug them directly into the wall; keep the heater at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn; place the heater on a solid, flat surface; space heaters should be turned off when you're not in the room or are asleep; keep children and pets away from space heaters; choose a heater with a thermostat and overheat protection, as well as an auto shut-off tip over safeguard.



### **Holiday Lights Recycling Program**

This holiday season, the Village of Streamwood will again partner with Elgin Recycling for a Holiday Lights Recycling Program. The program will run from Monday, November 13 until Friday, February 9. If you have old holiday lights to recycle, you can drop them off at any of four (4) convenient locations: Village Hall, Public Works, Poplar Creek Public Library, and Park Place Family Recreation Center. Lights accepted include mini-lights, Italian lights, C7 and C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, as well as extension cords. Simply place old, broken, and unused lights, cords, and strands in the designated containers.

### **Community Development Hours**

With daylight saving time ending, please note that as of November 9, the Community Development Department will no longer be open until 7:00 pm on Thursdays. The Department will close at 4:30 pm.

This team, of 15 volunteer Streamwood Police Officers, came in with a time of 6.4 seconds and raised over \$1,700 for the Special Olympic Athletes! Everyone in attendance had a great time working together for such a great cause!

### Applications For Holiday Programs

Hanover Township families facing financial hardship can now apply online for the annual December holiday sponsor-a-family and toy drive programs. Residents can visit [hanover-township.org](http://hanover-township.org) to complete an application. A Spanish registration form is also available. Applications will be accepted through December 15. A valid ID, a current utility bill or piece of mail, birth certificate for children 0-15 years old or medical card showing child's name and birth date, and proof of income covering the last 30 days is required. Additional items may be requested to determine eligibility.

Those wishing to sponsor a family this holiday season can call the Hanover Township Astor Avenue Community Center at 630-540-9085 or email [holidays@hanover-township.org](mailto:holidays@hanover-township.org). Donations of new, unwrapped toys can also be dropped off at any Township office.

### Appointments For Winter Heating Assistance

Hanover Township is now scheduling in-person and over-the-phone appointments for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) program. LIHEAP helps income eligible households pay for home energy services. The LIHEAP program runs through August 15, 2024, or until funds are exhausted. Starting October 2, households that are income eligible and 60 years or older, have a disability, or have a child in the house under the age of 6 can apply. Starting November 1, households that are income eligible and have at least 1 utility disconnected or have received a disconnection notice can apply. Starting December 1, all other households who are income eligible can apply for energy services. Applicants must live within the Township and provide all required documentation at the appointment, including: proof of Social Security cards; proof of gross income for all household members from the last 30-days; a copy of the most current gas and electric bills. Adults 55 and older seeking to schedule an appointment should call the Hanover Township Senior Center at 630-483-5660. Residents under the age of 55 should call the Hanover Township Astor Avenue Community Center at 630-540-9085.

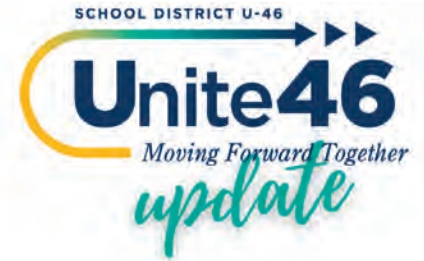


## School District U-46

### Unite U-46 Update

U-46 continues to move forward in working to meet the recommendations of the Unite U-46 community engagement initiative, which include shifting to a true middle school model and enhancing the educational experience for all students. Earlier this fall, the U-46 Board of Education voted to approve: retiring Abbott Middle School and Ellis Middle School at the conclusion of the 2025-26 school year; make additions at Kenyon Woods and Kimble Middle Schools; and construct a new middle school building that will be ready for the 2026-27 year.

A few weeks later, attendees at the next Unite U-46 community engagement session provided their input on related issues, such as establishing priorities and standards for building updates, evaluating criteria for new attendance boundaries districtwide, and reviewing options for how students, staff, and families will transition to new schools. More Unite U-46 sessions will be held this winter and spring, and all members of the community are urged to participate. ### Explore

U-46's 8th graders left Explore 2023 with a better understanding of the opportunities available to them in high school and the direct connection between academic curriculum and future careers. Explore, held this year on October 5 at the NOW Arena, is an annual event put on by the school district and Alignment Collaborative for Education. Students from the District's eight middle schools attended Explore during the school day in three different shifts. Ahead of time, each student worked in a digital college and career planning system to learn which career clusters align with their current interests and aptitudes. Using this information, they worked with counselors to select a career pathway to learn more about at Explore.

About 50 local businesses, industries, governmental organizations, and nonprofits had exhibits at Explore, staffed by representatives who engaged in discussions and hands-on activities with students. In addition, each of the District's five Magnet Academies had teachers and high schoolers present, and U-46's culinary, health sciences, education, automotive, welding, and precision manufacturing programs were represented as well.

Itsani Albarran-Isidoro, an 8th grader at Tefft Middle School in Streamwood, said she was glad to attend Explore before choosing her courses for freshman year. "Time flies by quickly," she said. "Electives in high school really help you out. This is a great time to get to know what you might be interested in focusing on."
