#### **Body-Worn Camera Program Implementation**

According to the President's Task Force on 21st Century Policing Report, it was recommended that police departments implement a body worn camera program to enhance transparency and accountability between the public and police officers. The Illinois Association of Chiefs of Police and the International Association of Chiefs of Police have recommended that police departments adopt a body-worn camera program. In 2021, under House Bill 3653 (SAFE-T Act), the Illinois General Assembly required the wearing of body worn cameras for a municipality



of under 50,000 residents by January 1, 2025. The Streamwood Police Department supports the use of body-worn cameras and prefers to implement them as soon as possible rather than waiting for the deadline. To that end the Streamwood Police Department adopted the Axon BW3 body-worn camera. We are currently in the process of setting up the necessary framework for the cameras and will begin training on them soon. We anticipate a limited roll-out in April, with full department implementation in May.

#### Streamwood Environmental Education Day (SEED)

Join us for a day filled with environmental-friendly information and activities for all ages! Our Community Relations Commission presents SEED on Saturday, April 27, from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm. As part of this event, Streamwood residents can drop off televisions and electronics for recycling, as well as paper for shredding, in the parking lot behind Village Hall. #### **Keep Storm Drains Clear and Clean**



When rain falls only some soaks into the ground. Areas with a lot of pavement, such as driveways, streets and sidewalks, have more storm water runoff because the ground can't absorb the water. Water flows toward the streets and then into a storm drain. Many people believe that storm drains are connected to a sewage treatment plant; they

aren't. Anything that goes down the storm drain goes untreated into local area streams and lakes. Help us keep our natural water areas clean!

#### **Distracted Driving Campaign**

April is Distracted Driving Awareness Month. With warmer weather, more vehicles and pedestrians are out and about. The Streamwood Police Department will be participating with the Illinois State Police and over 200 local law enforcement agencies in the Illinois Department of Transportation's distracted driving campaign beginning Monday, April 1 through Tuesday, April 30. Texting while behind the wheel tops the list of distractions, but other actions are just as unsafe such as setting up your navigation system, changing radio stations, scrolling through social media, drinking and eating, applying makeup or shaving, dealing with kids or pets, and so much more! If you are distracted while you are driving, you deprive yourself of important seconds that may be needed to avoid a close call or serious accident. The Streamwood Police Department urges all drivers to focus on the road.

#### 2024 Motor Fuel Tax Utilization

Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) is a tax based on the consumption or purchase of motor fuel in Illinois. MFT funds are collected by the State of Illinois and distributed to local municipalities on a per capita basis. Municipalities receive and utilize these resources to fund critical transportation infrastructure projects in their cities, villages, and towns. MFT funds can be used to construct and maintain roads, traffic controls, street lighting, storm sewers, sidewalks and other pedestrian paths, off-street parking facilities, and much more. In 2024, the Village Board recently adopted its annual resolution authorizing the appropriation of Motor Fuel Tax (MFT) funds (\$3.2 million) for road reconstruction and resurfacing in our community.

#### 50/50 Parkway Tree Program

Streamwood's Parkway Tree Program gives residents the opportunity to purchase a tree for their parkway at 50% of the cost — you pay half the cost of the tree, and the Village pays the other half! #### **2024 Presidential Primary Election**

Early Voting will be held in the Streamwood Community Development Garage (351 E Irving Park Road, behind Village Hall) Monday, March 4 through Monday, March 18 with hours as follows: Monday through Saturday, 9:00 am to 5:00 pm; Sunday, 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. The hours and dates are stipulated by the Cook County Clerk. All eligible suburban Cook County voters are welcome. For a complete list of early voting sites, please check the Cook County Clerk's website: cookcountyclerk.com/elections or call 312-603-0900.



Voter registration will be available during early voting. If you wish to register, or change your information, you must bring two pieces of identification - one with your current Cook County address. A designated drop box will be located with the early voting judges (in the garage) for those voters who have a mail-in ballot and do not wish to use the USPS mail during early voting only.

Election Day is Tuesday, March 19, 2024. Polls open at 6:00 am and close at 7:00 pm. On Election Day, you MUST vote at your home precinct location.



#### Don't Block The Sidewalk

Police enforcement begins Friday, March 1! Please do not park over any sidewalk between 7:00 am to 9:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and 9:00 am to 9:00 pm, Saturday and Sunday, per Village Ordinance 5-3-1(L). Violation of this ordinance may be subject to a citation, with a minimum fine of \$25.

#### **Prepare For Severe Weather**

Spring brings us green grass, budding flowers, green trees, and long-awaited warmer temperatures. But spring is also the beginning of the severe storm season. In our area, we are susceptible to many types of severe weather. The Streamwood Fire



Department would like to provide some tips to help keep you safe before, during, and after severe weather: use battery-powered flashlights and lanterns during power outages, remember candles, especially unattended, have a high likelihood of causing a fire; make sure you have working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms; use surge protectors; create or review your home fire safety escape plan; and never enter a flooded basement. Be Weather-Aware: Check the forecast regularly to see if you're at risk of severe weather. Listen to local news or a NOAA Weather Radio to stay informed about weather watches and warnings. Most smart-phone weather applications provide severe weather alert options.

#### **Need To Dispose Of An Old Flag?**

There is a flag disposal box in Village Hall just inside the front (east) doors. Simply drop off any flags that no longer fit for public use. Members of VFW Post 5151 will ensure its proper destruction.

#### Registration For 2024-25 School Year Now Open

Families with school-age children are encouraged to begin early registration by following the instructions available at u-46.org/registration. No instructional fees will be collected. Early registration helps the District make important decisions about staffing, classrooms, and transportation. If you have a child entering kindergarten, 6th, 9th, or 12th grades next school year, the state of Illinois has certain health requirements for them. For incoming seniors, that means proving they are up to date on their meningococcal vaccine. For students in the other listed grades, physical exams and certain immunizations are required. Families are encouraged to make doctor's appointments now, since pediatrician's offices are very busy in the summer.



Public Works will collect branches, free of charge, from your curbside during designated collection days. Simply place branches at the curb by 6:00 am on the day your area is scheduled for pickup. It is important to have your branches out by the scheduled morning listed below to



avoid being missed by the branch pickup crews. Crews collect branches as soon as possible but cannot be expected to return if branches are not out in time. Branches must be placed with the cut ends facing the street. Branches cannot be longer than ten feet (10') in length and have a diameter of no larger than six inches (6"). The Village is divided into four areas for pickup service (see map). Each area receives branch pickup service once per month.

Crews try to collect branches as soon as possible. It usually takes more than one day to collect all branches in each area; however, the branches must be at the curb by 6:00 am on the first day your area is scheduled for pickup.
