

29th Citizens Police Academy

Streamwood Environmental Education Day (SEED) Recap

At the annual community SEED event, held on April 27, residents recycled almost 33,500 pounds of electronic goods. This was over 11,000 pounds more than last year. At the police station, whiling enjoying the educational exhibitors, we collected 70 pounds of needles/sharps and over 100 pounds of unused/expired prescription and over-the-counter drugs. As part of the Holiday Lights Recycling Program this past winter, residents recycled 1,818 pounds of lights and cords. Working together, we have kept harmful elements and chemicals out of the landfill!

Noise Control Regulations

The Village has noise control regulations setting specific hours for loud noises to allow the police to control these issues. Noise complaints in residential areas include loud music, late night parties, yelling and shouting while concerns in the business areas tend toward amplified sounds, garbage collection, and loading and unloading. In general, no construction, loud music, garbage collection, loading and unloading will be permitted between the hours of 10:00 pm and 7:00 am on weekdays, and 10:00 pm and 10:00 am on the weekends. Exceptions are permitted for emergencies, and other events. If you are concerned about loud noises in your area, please contact the Streamwood Police Department by calling 9-1-1.



Garage Sales

Please obtain a garage sale permit before the sale is conducted. There is a \$1.00 charge for the permit. Please note that only TWO garage sales per year are permitted for each address and each sale is only permitted for TWO consecutive days, between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm.

Avoid Unwanted Wildlife

Per Village Code 4-2-5: G. Ground Feeding Prohibited - the ground feeding of feral animals is hereby declared a nuisance and is prohibited. (Ord. 2010-9, 5-6-2010) Tips to make your residence less desirable to rodents, coyote, skunks, and other unwanted wildlife:

- Secure garbage cans/lids tightly and make sure dumpster lids are closed especially at night
- · Remove bird feeders from property
- Never leave pet food outside overnight
- Remove brush and/or wood piles to eliminate areas of possible shelter
- Seal all openings around the foundation of your home
- Use window well covers to prevent skunks from falling into window wells you can also use wire mesh
- Consider fencing to keep skunks off property or at least away from small areas like gardens
- Motion-activated devices meant to scare wildlife such as strobe lights are generally not very effective - but may do the trick in some situations

If you do not provide food, water, or a "place to stay" — they will go elsewhere.

Smoke Alarm Installation Program

The Streamwood Fire Department, in partnership with the Office of the State Fire Marshal and Illinois Fire Safety Alliance, is offering FREE smoke detector replacement to all Streamwood residents as part of the Be Alarmed! Smoke Alarm Installation Program. Fire Department personnel will install 10-year, sealed-battery smoke detectors in every room and every level of your home, along with providing information on home fire safety and prevention. To date, over 100 smoke alarms have been installed in Streamwood. Smoke detectors are an essential part of home fire safety and we encourage all residents to take advantage of this opportunity. 

School District U-46

Celebrating The Class Of 2024

Family members, friends, and U-46 employees turned out in large numbers on Saturday, May 25, to celebrate more than 2,700 students who graduated as members of the #U46Classof2024. Five commencement ceremonies were held at the NOW Arena to honor the students who graduated from Bartlett, Elgin, Larkin, South Elgin, and Streamwood High Schools.

Of the graduates, more than 650 students participated in the district's award-winning Dual Language program; many of them had been a part of program since kindergarten, when the current Dual Language program first became available to them.

More than 280 graduates earned the State of Illinois Seal of Biliteracy, showing that they've demonstrated proficiency in one or more languages besides English. Approximately 250 earned the Commendation, given to students who have demonstrated significant progress toward achieving a high level of proficiency. Languages that students were recognized for include Spanish, Polish, Japanese, Tagalog, Urdu, Lithuanian, Chinese, Punjabi, Russian, French, Hindi, Hungarian, Turkish, and Gujarati.

The Class of 2024 graduates also included 30 Superintendent's Scholarship recipients, a program that honors first-generation college students, and 47 students who participated in the full-time Dual Credit program on the campus of Elgin Community College. Thirty-five of those students graduated high school with the equivalent of an associate degree in addition to their high school diploma.
