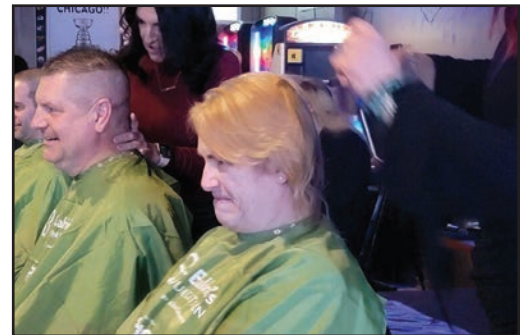

Additional Community Events Signs

The Village Board has approved funding two additional community events signs as part of the overall Village Comprehensive Plan to improve communication. Once received, one will be located at the corner of Madison Drive and Irving Park Road, with the other at Schaumburg Road and East Avenue.

Spring And Summer Is Construction Season!

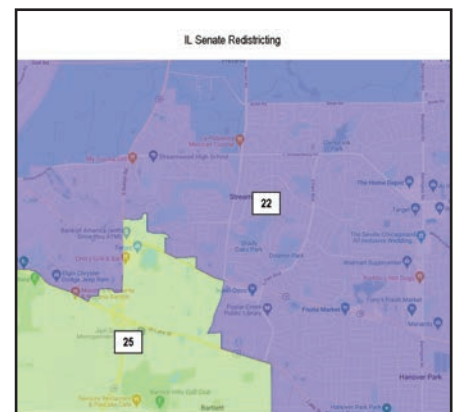
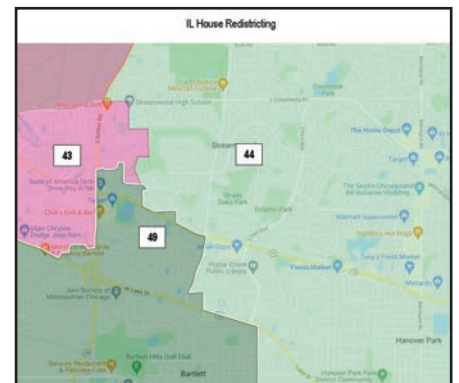
Many important infrastructure improvements are scheduled in and around Streamwood this year. Cook County will be rehabilitating Schaumburg Road from Route 59 to East Ave. Construction is scheduled to start in late spring 2022. Traffic will often be limited to one lane in each direction.

The Illinois Department of Transportation will be widening the intersection of Irving Park Road and Bartlett Road, starting in April. Dedicated right turn lanes will be added to all four corners. Traffic will be limited to one lane in each direction for most of 2022. They will also be resurfacing Irving Park Road from Route 59 west to Shales Parkway in spring of 2022. This resurfacing project will exclude the section from Wildflower Way to Schaumburg Road, which is currently scheduled for construction and widening in 2023.

Water main is scheduled to be replaced on Hillside Drive west of Park Boulevard and on Surrey Drive this spring and summer. In addition the Village of Streamwood is planning to resurface the following streets this year: Bonded, Bourbon, Brandy, Burgundy, Canton, Dover, Frances, Fulton, Gant, Heather, Hillside, Innsbrook, Kensington, Lancaster, LaSalle, Manchester, Pembroke, Phoenix Lake, Ramblewood, Regency, Shag Bark, Sheffield, Surrey, Virginia, Weston, Wild Rose, and Victoria (N). IL House And Senate Redistricting

The decennial Census is conducted to determine Congressional and state legislative districts. Since 2000, Streamwood has been in one Congressional (8), one state senate (22), and one state house (44) district. With the most recent redistricting maps adopted by the Illinois General Assembly, Streamwood will now be in two Congressional Districts (3 and 8); two state senatorial districts (22 and 25); and three state house districts (43, 44, and 49). Valuing Planting And Caring Of Trees

Streamwood was named a 2021 Tree City USA® by

the Arbor Day Foundation, in honor of its commitment to effective urban forest management, for the 30th consecutive year! The Village achieved this recognition by meeting the program's four requirements: a tree board or department, a tree care ordinance, an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita and an Arbor Day observance and proclamation. Noise Control Regulations

The Village has noise control regulations setting specific hours for loud noises to allow the police to control these issues. Noise complaints in residential areas include loud music, late night parties, yelling and shouting while concerns in the business areas tend toward amplified sounds, garbage collection and loading and unloading. In general, no construction, loud music, garbage collection, loading and unloading will be permitted between the hours of 10:00 pm to 7:00 am on weekdays, and 10:00 pm to 10:00 am on the weekends. Exceptions are permitted for emergencies, and other events. If you are concerned about loud noises in your area, please contact the Police Department by calling 9-1-1.

Financial Reporting Award

Garage Sales

Please obtain a garage sale permit before the sale is conducted. There is a \$1.00 fee for the permit. Please note that only two garage sales per year are permitted for each address. Garage sales may be held for two consecutive days between the hours of 9:00 am - 5:00 pm. Sign placement information is also available.



Parking

Between the hours of 1:00 am - 5:00 am, parking is prohibited on Village streets, except where noted in specific subdivisions. Blocking the sidewalk with a vehicle is prohibited from March 1 through November 30. Vehicles parked in residential driveways CANNOT block the sidewalk or parkway between the hours of 7:00 am - 9:00 pm, Monday through Friday; and 9:00 am - 9:00 pm, Saturday and Sunday. Questions? Planning A Block Party This Summer?

Block party applications are available at the Cashier's Counter at Village Hall and on the website. The forms provide party planners with the necessary details (Fire and/or Police Department visits and Public Works barricades) needed BEFORE the date of the party. All block party applications must be filed with the Village Clerk at least 14 days before the requested party date.



2022 Walking Inspections Program

The Village will begin conducting its annual Walking Inspections Program in June. Inspectors will be checking maintenance of exterior items such as grass/weeds, home condition (roof, siding, windows), excess exterior storage, and refuse containers. 2022 Primary Election

The Illinois 2022 Gubernatorial Primary Election is Tuesday, June 28. Polls open at 6:00 am and close at 7:00 pm. On Election Day, you MUST vote at your home precinct location. Watch your mail for a new Voter Registration Card from Cook County. You can check your registration and locate your home precinct at cookcountyclerk.com. Early Voting for the 2022 Primary Election will be held in the garage, behind Streamwood Village Hall, starting on Monday, June 13 through Monday, June 27. All eligible suburban Cook County voters are welcome. Hours are as follows:

Voter registration will also be available during Early Voting. If you wish to register, or need to change your information, you must bring two pieces of identification — one with your current Cook County address.

Freedom Cruise Night Car Show

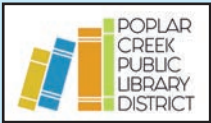

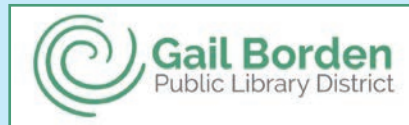

U-46 Registration Open For 2022-23 School Year

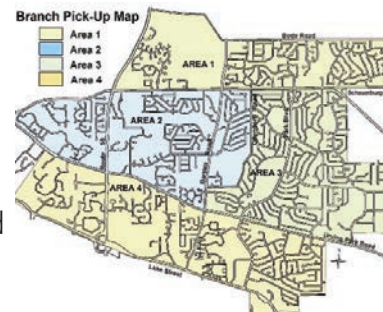

Branch Pickup

Public Works collects branches, free of charge, from your curbside during designated collection days. Simply place branches at the curb by 6:00 am on the day your area is scheduled for pickup. It is important to have your branches out by the scheduled morning listed below in order to avoid being missed by the branch pickup crews. Crews collect branches as soon as possible but cannot be expected to return if branches are not out in time.



Branches must be placed with the cut ends facing the street. Branches cannot be longer than ten feet (10') in length and have a diameter of no larger than six inches (6").

The Village is divided into four areas for pickup service (see map). Each area receives branch pickup service one time per month.

Crews try to collect branches as soon as possible. It usually takes more than one day to collect all branches. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Public Works at 630-736-3850.
