2020 Census

Be counted! The 2020 Census determines congressional representation. It also determines how federal funding is spent and provides data that will impact our community for the next decade.

Think of your morning commute. Census results influence highway planning and construction. Think of our local schools. Census results help determine how money is allocated for key programs and grants that support teachers and special education. The list goes on, including programs to restore wildlife, prevent child abuse, prepare for disasters, and more.

In mid-March, households will begin receiving official Census Bureau mail with detailed information on how to respond. By April 1, 2020, every home will receive an invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. You have three options for responding including online, by phone, or by mail.

In order to make sure your voice is heard, it's important that you are counted. The data on population from the Census is used to distribute funds for highways, schools, emergency grants, disaster relief, and much more. Starting this month, the Census will be sending information to every household. Please make sure everyone living in your house is counted!

It has certainly been an odd winter: from early snows, to deep cold, to temperatures in the 50s. We've had some sunshine, gray days, snow, cold, rain, and sleet — sometimes all on the same day! Now that spring is almost here, it's time to get out of the house, shake off the cabin fever, and join us for a number of great community events!

Yardwaste Pickup

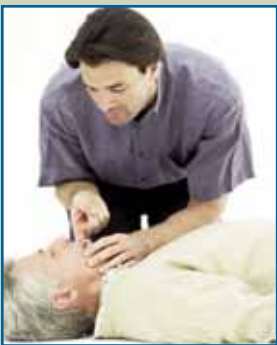

Need To Dispose Of An Old Flag?

There is a flag disposal box in Village Hall just inside the front (east) doors. Simply drop off any flags no longer fit for public use. Members of VFW Post 5151 will ensure its proper destruction in accordance with the US Flag Code.

Storm sewers drain directly to area water ways. Whenever dirt or debris enters the storm sewer system, these pollutants can also endanger our water supply. Help keep our water supply clean!

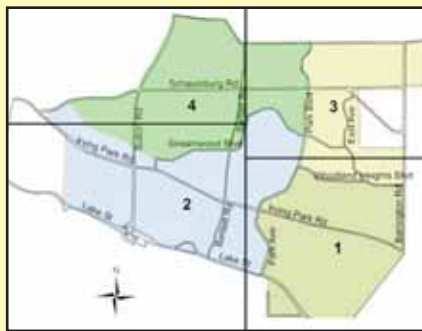
Project Guidelines Online

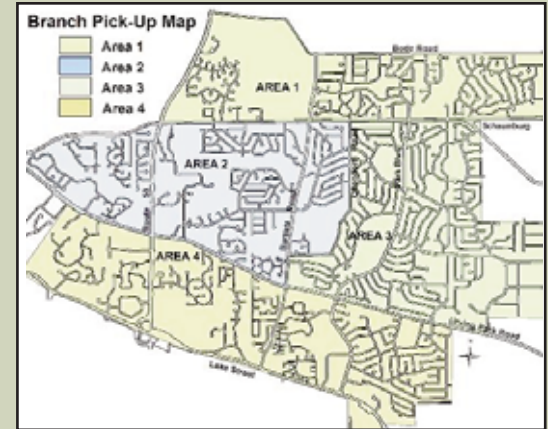
Branch Pickup

During the months from April-October, Public Works will collect branches, free of charge, from your curbside during designated collection days. Simply place branches at the curb by 6:00 am on the day your area is scheduled for pickup. It is important to have your branches out by the scheduled morning listed below in order to avoid being missed by the branch pickup crews. Crews cannot be expected to return if branches are not out in time.

Branches must be placed with the cut ends facing the street. Branches cannot be longer than ten feet (10') in length, and have a diameter of no larger than six (6) inches.

The Village is divided into four areas for pickup service (see map). Each area receives branch pickup service one time per month.

Crews try to collect branches as soon as possible. It may take more than one day to collect all branches. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Public Works at (630) 736-3850.

Cross Connection Control (Backflow) Program

Backflow preventers or cross connection controls ensure that our water system is kept safe. Backflow preventers may be found on both commercial and residential systems. Commercial customers will have backflow preventers just after the water meter. Residential backflow preventers may be on lawn irrigation systems, fire protection systems, or swimming pools.

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) requires a comprehensive cross connection control program to ensure that all backflow preventers are properly operating and maintained. This includes an annual test of the system. To ensure compliance with the IEPA, the Village has partnered with Aqua Backflow, Inc. to coordinate and manage the test reports. They will be reaching out to water customers separately. Questions on the testing program should be directed to Aqua Backflow at (847) 742-2296.

As part of this effort, the Village is conducting a simple Cross Connection Control survey. A copy of the survey is included in the March water bill and available online at www.streamwood.org. We appreciate your help in completing this survey to keep our water system safe!

Recycle Right!

Recycling is great for the environment. But, it's important to Recycle Right! Include foil, glass or plastic bottles and jars, newspapers and magazines. Make sure recyclables are clean and empty. Replace lids and caps. Flatten cardboard.

Do not include take out containers that have food on them, paper coffee cups or juice cartons. Advanced does not take hangers, chains, clothing, food, styrofoam, plastic bags, or large items such as electronics or wood.

Volunteer with Township Emergency Services

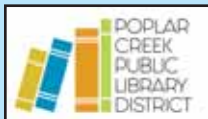
