2020 Census Get Counted!




The 2020 Census is underway! Letters and postcards were sent in March and April. You can reply online, by mail, or by phone. To make yourself count - visit 2020census.gov.

COVID-19

The Coronavirus, or COVID-19, is a serious respiratory illness. In March, Governor Pritzker issued an expansive Shelter-in-Place order for all Illinoisans in response to the COVID-19 crisis. The order was extended until **May 30**.

Our priority is the safety of our residents. Please heed the Shelter-in-Place order.

Do not go out except for necessary services such as food, prescriptions or doctor visits. Avoid any large gatherings, maintain six (6) foot gaps to promote social distancing, and wear face coverings when out.

Our buildings remain closed to the public. But, the Village is doing its part to ensure that the services our community needs remain, while keeping our employees safe:

- We are conducting business electronically or by phone and mail
- Inspections are very limited; mandatory inspections are by appointment only
- We have extended all permit expiration dates
- We have suspended new late fees and water shut-offs
- Social distancing techniques are used during our regular course of business

We encourage residents to call (630) 736-3844 if you have general questions or need help. Call 911 for police or fire.

Remember to follow the CDC and State guidelines for good health:

- Wash your hands often
- Cover all coughs and sneezes
- Stay home if you are sick
- Maintain six (6) feet for social distancing
- Wear a face covering

Make sure you also take some time for yourself. The State has a program allowing residents to talk to mental health professionals, free of charge, during the COVID-19 crisis. **Call4Calm** lets residents text the word "TALK" to 552020 (for Spanish, text "HABLAR") to connect with this free service.

Meeting and Event Update

Village buildings remain closed to the public as we continue to support and promote social distancing. We will hold our next Board meeting on May 7 in the Council Chambers.

Our Streamwood Environmental Education Day (SEED) event, originally scheduled for April 25, was canceled. We are looking to hold an e-waste recycling and drug drop off later in the year. Given the expanded Shelter-in-Place order, we have canceled our annual Memorial Day Observance. No decision has been made in regard to July 4th Fireworks or Summer Celebration.

On March 6, members of the Police and Fire Department shaved their heads to support and raise money for those battling childhood cancer. Over \$28,000 was raised! Thanks to all of our volunteers, especially raffle organizer Linda Cussen and the Chicago Loop for hosting the event.

Construction Update

Despite the virus, a number of construction projects have continued as trade work was deemed essential by the Governor's order. Work on the replacement of Fire Station #31 is on schedule for a March, 2021 opening. Work on our Public Works renovations continues.

Roadwork on Irving Park Road is moving along. Noise walls and fencing, water main replacement and a multi-use path are being installed on the south side of the road. Work is expected to be done in July.

Shopping Safely Tips

Grocery stores are an essential business - and a true necessity. When you must go out to the store, be safe! Consider the following:

- **Shopping at a time that's less busy.** You'll have less of a chance of running into people.
- Keeping social distance and wear face covering. Keep six feet away from other shoppers and grocery staff and wear face covering while shopping indoors.
- Using wipes to clean carts/baskets. You might bring your own, in case the store is out.
- **Carrying sanitizer**. Use before and after shopping.
- Using touch-less payment methods. This limits the risk of virus transmission through money.
- Using self-checkout lanes. This limits contact with store employees.

On May 1, more businesses will be allowed to offer pickup at curbside or delivery services. We encourage you to shop local. Shopping local will help our business community rebound after the pandemic. Our businesses hire your neighbors, and keep your property taxes low.


Village Hall Hours (by phone and appointment only):

Branch Pickup Program

Public Works collects branches, free of charge, from your curb during designated collection days. Place branches at the curb by 6:00 am on the day your area is scheduled for pickup. Branches must be placed with the cut ends facing the street. **Branches cannot be larger than ten feet (10') in length, and no larger than six inches (6") in diameter.**

The Village is divided into four areas for pickup service (see map). Each area gets branch pickup service once per month.

It is important to have your branches out by the listed day in order to avoid being missed by the branch pickup crews, although it may take more than one day to collect everything. If you have questions or concerns, please contact Public Works at (630) 736-3850.
