Village Board News

Code Amendments — Business Licensing Changes

The Village Board recently passed several amendments to Village Code to expand business opportunities in the areas of food truck vending, alcohol sales in gas station convenience stores, and commercial food production and sales for home-based businesses. With the approval of these new regulations the Village now allows food trucks to operate in conjunction with a special event, such a wedding, corporate event, or block party. The special event must be approved by the Village, the food truck must also be licensed with the Village and have approval from the Cook County Health Department in advance of the event.

Also, gas stations with convenience stores are now permitted to sell packaged beer and wine. There are additional limitations on this type of alcohol sales, and it is also subject to the gas station operator obtaining the appropriate liquor licensing.

Lastly, in accordance with new State legislation, the Village allows "cottage food" businesses to sell certain food items that have an extended shelf life, such as jams, jellies, syrups, pickled or fermented produce, soups, baked goods, and candies. Cottage foods are certain foods or drinks that are prepared in a home-based kitchen and packaged for retail sale directly to the public. Cottage food businesses must be licensed with the Village and inspected by the Cook County Health Department prior to producing/selling any goods. 
Village Board News

Enjoy A Walk - Safely!

The Village continues its work on improving bicycle and pedestrian paths throughout the community. We welcome resident input on our plans and prioritizing areas for improvement. But we don't want you to wait until the paths are fully installed — we encourage you to get out and enjoy a walk but want you to be careful. Remember to stay on sidewalks or paths if present. Where there are gaps or missing paths, please stay on the street close to the curb. Be mindful of vehicles entering, existing, or navigating the roads.

Police Beat Meetings

The Police Department patrols the Village in distinct geographic areas, called "beats", and holds regular meetings with the community. The primary purpose of a beat meeting is to provide police, residents, and other community stake holders the opportunity to discuss conditions in the neighborhood and develop strategies to address any concerns. Regular meetings also provide an opportunity for police and community to get to know one another. The August Beat meetings will be held in the police station training room (401 E Irving Park Road), at 7:00 pm. Beats #2 and #3 will be held on Thursday, August 4; Beats #1 and #4 on Thursday, August 25.

Wipers On? Headlights Need To Be On Too!

Just a reminder to all motorists that when using your windshield wipers in rainy weather, you MUST also turn on your vehicle's headlights.

Do You Have Old Eyeglasses Or Hearing Aids To Discard?

Garage Sales

Please obtain a garage sale permit before the sale is conducted. There is a \$1.00 charge for the permit. Please note that only TWO garage sales per year are permitted for each address and each sale is only permitted for TWO consecutive days, between the hours of 9:00 am and 5:00 pm.

Planning A Block Party?

Block Party applications are available at the cashier's counter at Village Hall and on the Village's website. The forms provide the party planners with necessary details (Fire Department and/or Police Department visits and Public Works barricades) needed BEFORE the date of their party. All Block Party applications must be filed with the Village Clerk at least 14 days before the requested party date.

Please call Public Works at 630-736-3850 before cutting any trees on your property. Forestry Department personnel will check the tree, its location, etc. This is a FREE service.

School News



School District U-46

First Day of 2022-23 School Year

The first day of the 2022-23 school year in School District U-46 will be Tuesday, August 16, and school administrators have some tips to make sure children in the district are #U46FirstDayReady.

For all students, please make sure the online registration process has been completed. Detailed instructions can be found at u-46.org/registration. There will be no instructional fees collected as the District is covering the cost for the 2022-23 school year as a measure of relief for families who have struggled financially during the COVID-19 pandemic. School supplies are also being provided by U-46 for all K-6 students. If you have a child who will be entering kindergarten, 6th, 9th, 12th grades for 2022-23, the state of Illinois has certain health requirements for those students. For incoming seniors, that means proving they are up to date on their meningococcal vaccine. For students in the other listed grades, physical exams and certain immunizations are required. You can find details on the requirements, as well as the necessary forms, in English and Spanish, by clicking on "Health Forms" at u-46.org/health.

New Principals Welcomed At Two Streamwood Schools

As the new school year starts, two new principals will be leading Canton Middle School and Glenbrook Elementary School, both located in the Village of Streamwood. Ms. Kimberly Rudden, the incoming principal of Canton, is a Streamwood High School graduate who attended Canton Middle School herself. Ms. Rudden has been an educator in U-46 for 21 years, including the last three school years as an associate principal at Streamwood High where she oversaw the school counseling department, teaching and learning, the coordination of testing, and building operations. She succeeds Mr. Jeff Smith, who retired in June.

At Glenbrook, Mr. Rajan Sharma will take over the role of principal. Mr. Sharma brings 16 years of experience in the educational field, including the last two years as the assistant principal at Horizon Elementary School in U-46. The former Glenbrook principal, Ms. Cheryl DeRoo, retired at the end of the last school year.

Next Unite U-46 Session

Finally, U-46 is asking all community members, whether they have children in U-46 schools or not, to plan on attending the next Unite U-46 session on Wednesday, September 14 at 7:00 pm. Both an in-person and virtual options are available.

Unite U-46 is a community engagement initiative that seeks to develop recommendations on the best way to implement the long-range vision of the Board of Education; this vision includes shifting middle school to include grades 6th, 7th, and 8th (the current model has 6th grade a part of elementary school); using the space in elementary schools to expand early childhood opportunities across U-46; and to replace and/or renovate some of our older buildings to provide equitable access to learning environments that support academic success for all. Each Unite U-46 session has a specific focus; this one will be on how school building improvements are funded and what are the options U-46 has for moving the process forward.
