Our 38th Annual Luminaria is scheduled for Friday, December 2 at 6:30 pm. Once set up and lit—this is a spectacular sight! The candles continue to glow for hours into the night.

Bag assembly will take place in the garage behind Village Hall, during normal business hours, Monday through Friday from 8:00 am - 4:30 pm. Our goal is to have bag assembly complete by November 29. Island assignments, for placing/lighting luminaria, will be announced shortly thereafter.

On December 2, the entire Municipal Campus will be filled with light, as luminaria line Village Hall, the Police Station, and Veterans Memorial. There will also be thousands of colorful, twinkling lights covering the trees as we will hold a tree lighting ceremony. We are hoping Santa will arrive for a visit at Village Hall! Village Board News

Goals and Objectives Adopted

Our 2023 Goals and Objectives were adopted by the Village Board at its October 20 meeting. The annual Goals and Objectives provide a blueprint for staff to create our budget and determine key priorities for the community in 2023. Our ongoing priorities remain keeping our budget balanced and continuing



quality programs and services to the community. The Board reaffirmed their commitment toward the implementation of our Comprehensive Plan in its 2023 focus goals. Specific projects include continued improvements at Bartlett and Irving Park Roads, and at Bartlett and Streamwood Boulevard, improved communications, along with the continued investments in our community and facilities, development of bike paths throughout the Village, a bridge across Route 59, and improved economic development and beautification efforts.

Energov

The Village recently began using a new enterprise system that allows for online submittals and more streamlined processing of certain licenses and permits, such as building permits, contractor licenses, business licenses, rental licenses, and zoning requests. The system also allows for convenient online submittals of general resident or code enforcement concerns in a matter of minutes using the 311-service request portal. Please visit streamwood.org for more detailed information or to file a request using the Citizen Self Service (CSS) portal. While submittals through the CSS and 311 portals are strongly encouraged for efficiency, you are still welcome to make submit a request in-person, by regular mail, or email.

Do You Own Residential Rental Property?

Please know that all residential rental properties must be licensed by the Village. Renewal letters for currently licensed property will be sent out in October and are due by Saturday, December 31. Recent Developments

The Village Board recently approved several new developments. The Oasis Senior Living Facility will be located west of Route 59 on the north side of Irving Park Road, close to Sunny Hill Park. The new facility will have 90 units of assisted and memory care living. The Board also approved a new cannabis dispensary that will be located in the former Payless Shoe Store on Barrington Road. Finally, the Board also approved development of a new Chipotle restaurant on Route 59. The new restaurant took over the former Fifth/Third Bank location. The new restaurant is equipped with a 'Chipotlane' that allows customers to order online and get their order from the mobile drive-thru.

Property Tax Bills from County Delayed

The second installment of Cook County Property Tax bills will be significantly delayed this year. First, our area was subject to the triennial assessment. This is when all properties are reevaluated for tax purposes. This was followed by a technical update to the Assessor's Office computer system, which prevented the new assessment data being sent to the Board of Review and ultimately the County Treasurer and County Clerk to finalize the bill mailing. Cook County has noted that these significant delays will result in revised payment due dates in 2023. Most property owners will likely end up receiving three (3) tax bills in 2023 — the 2nd installment from 2022, and the two installments for 2023. While the Village will also be impacted by these delays in funding, we want to make our residents and businesses aware that this will not impact our ability to provide services to the community.



CMAP Bike Plan Finalized

The Village Board heard a presentation from the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning (CMAP) on the final bicycle and pedestrian plan for Bartlett and Streamwood. The plan indicates how our two communities can work cooperatively to provide connections throughout our region. The Village Board has prioritized these connections in our community and will work toward improving access to facilities over the next year.

As part of the 20th Anniversary of Dunkin' and Illinois Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics Illinois, the Streamwood Police Department collected \$4,500 during Cop On A Rooftop Fundraiser on August 19. Holiday Lights Recycling Program

This holiday season, the Village of Streamwood will again partner with Elgin Recycling for a Holiday Lights Recycling Program. The program will run from Tuesday, November 1 until Wednesday, February 8. Last year's program was a success — approximately 1,500 pounds of lights were diverted from landfills. If you have old holiday lights to recycle, you can drop them off at any of four (4) convenient locations: Village Hall, Public Works, Poplar Creek Public Library, and Park Place Family Recreation Center. Lights accepted include mini-lights, Italian lights, C7 and C9 lights, rope lights, LED lights, as well as extension cords. Simply place old, broken, and unused lights, cords, and strands in the designated containers.

Election Day Polling Places

Leaf Raking Into The Street Is Prohibited

Please do not rake, sweep, or blow leaves into the street as it can clog storm sewer inlets and create flooding. All yard waste must be placed into approved containers for collection by Groot. Yard waste pickup ends the week of December 12-16.

Keep The Snow On The Parkway


Please be reminded that it is unlawful to shove or blow snow into the street. This is especially important after the plows come through. The plows clear the snow and lay salt. If you shovel snow onto the roadway, it can create ice slicks leading to dangerous road conditions. Please shovel or blow the snow to either side of your driveway onto the parkway.

Parking

Parking is prohibited on Village streets between the hours of 1:00 am and 5:00 am except where noted in specific subdivisions. Parking is also prohibited after a 2" or greater snowfall until streets are fully plowed. Questions? Call 630-736-3700. Through November 30, vehicles parked in residential driveways CANNOT block the sidewalk or parkway between the hours of 7:00 am and 9:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and from 9:00 am to 9:00 pm, Saturday and Sunday. However, vehicles, in residential driveways, may block the sidewalk or parkway from December 1 through February 28.

Tips For An Efficient Winter

- Use a shovel, ice cracker, or broom to clear snow from your sidewalk, porch, or driveway rather than gasoline-powered snow removal equipment. You can also use electronic products. Although they still consume energy, they do not emit greenhouse gases.
- Lower your thermostat temperature (or install a programmable thermostat) at night and whenever your home is unoccupied so that you don't waste natural resources by generating unneeded heat. Lowering your thermostat by 10 degrees at night can reduce your heating bill by 10 to 20 percent!
- ✓ To make sure your heating system (boiler, furnace, or heat pump) is operating at its most efficient, have a contractor perform a routine check-up and any necessary maintenance on the equipment before winter hits
- If your heating equipment is more than ten years old, it may be time for a replacement to a more energy-efficient unit. While initially an expensive investment, replacing old equipment with energy-efficient equipment saves more energy and money in the long run.
- Winter window ideas: weatherstrip and caulk any cracks you find in the window frames. Install simple plastic-film storm windows. Open the curtains, drapes, and blinds of any windows that receive direct sunlight during the day. Close the window coverings at night to keep the heat in.
- ✓ Use non-toxic de-icing substances such as clean clay cat litter, sand, or fireplace/stove ash to prevent hazardous waste from chemical de-icers.




Applications Now Available For Holiday Programs

Hanover Township families facing financial hardship may apply for the annual December holiday sponsor-a-family and toy drive programs. Residents can visit hanover-township.org to complete an application. A Spanish registration form is also available. Applications will be accepted through Monday, December 12. Required documents for the application process include a valid ID, a utility bill or piece of mail dated within the last 30 days, birth certificate for children 0-15 years old or medical card showing child's name and birth date and proof of income covering the last 30 days prior to the date of the application. Additional items may be requested to determine eligibility. Once a form is completed, Township staff will contact the resident for more information.

D.A.R.E. In Streamwood

The Streamwood Police Department's D.A.R.E. (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) program has been taught in Streamwood for 32 years! Each year the program reaches over 2,000 first- and fifthgrade students village-wide, with instruction at 9 different schools.

The first-grade program teaches a variety of safety lessons for children ages 5-7 years old. These include understanding 9-1-1, food safety, knowing your address and what to do if you get lost, knowing street signs, and stranger danger.

The fifth-grade program runs at all schools for 4 months. The curriculum is designed to help students make safe and responsible choices. The DARE officers discuss bullying, online safety, peer pressure, and the dangers of smoking and vaping, all while promoting self-confidence. You will often see the Streamwood Police Ice Cream Truck at community events for children, along with Hope, the new Comfort Dog of the Streamwood Police K9 Program!
